1 1/8 MILES. ( 1.463 ) 6TH RUNNING OF THE ALYDAR. Purse \$100,000 FOR FOUR-YEAR-OLDS AND UPWARD WHICH HAVE NEVER WON A SWEEPSTAKE IN 2018 OTHER THAN STATE-BRED. By subscription of \$100 each which should accompany the nomination; \$500 to pass the entry box and an additional \$500 to start. For horses not originally nominated, a supplemental payment of \$1,000 along with the entry and starting fees may be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. The purse to be divided 55% to the winner, 20% to second, 12% to third, 6% to fourth, 4% to fifth and 3% divided equally amongst the remaining finishers. Weight 124 lbs. Non-winners of a Graded Sweepstake at a mile or over in 2017 allowed 2 lbs.; of a Sweepstake at a mile or over in 2017 allowed 4 lbs.; of two races other than maiden, claiming or starter at a mile or over in 2018 allowed 6 lbs.; of such a race in 2018 allowed 8 lbs. A presentation will be made to the winning owner. Closed Saturday, July 21, 2018 with 17 Original Nominations and 1 Supplement.

REALM away alertly, remained along the inside route and bided time until the conclusion of the backstretch, tipped into path two at the top of the far turn and was switched over to a drive, out-raced PATCH for position the remainder of the trip to the quarter pole, fanned out approximately four wide into the stretch, narrowed in during the ensuing furlong, shifted inward during the final stages, all the while whittling down the deficit, got the head down in the final jump to wrest away the verdict. KURILOV (CHI) was patiently ridden stalking the leader three wide on both bends as well as the straightaway in between them, crept up to the leader after entering turn two, was yet being held in reserve leading the others into the stretch by a narrow margin, settled in and was called upon for more, gave the desired response, emerging at the eighth pole in possession of his largest lead, saw the winner chip away at it and got nipped. PATCH unhurried taking up the chase from path two during the initial stages, was asked to quicken at the top of the second bend, racing side by side out in path three with the eventual winner, angled five to six wide onto the head of the stretch, gained in a steadfast manner to garner the show. TIMELINE pursued the pacesetter two wide until the half mile pole, dove onto the inside route for a ground-saving respite past that station, was under a drive heading three wide into the lane, lacked the needed response. OUTPLAY broke alertly and went on establish control, carved out the pace on a loosely-contested lead, positioned in the two path while pulling slightly on the left, got collared by the runner up approaching the quarter pole, then backed away down the stretch.
